We must insist that you make an immediate replacement order and deliver it to us within 14 working days at no cost to ourselves.

You may not know the name Howard Shultz, but he made the coffee brand Starbucks one of the most famous company brands in the world today. Shultz was born in Brooklyn, New York, in 1953. His father was a truck driver and the Shultz family struggled with money. Howard Shultz was expected to follow his father's footsteps and become a truck driver. However, he had bigger dreams. He always worked hard and tried his best to face and overcome problems. In high school, he was a star football player. He was so successful that he won a football scholarship to a college in Michigan.

After graduating from college, his first jobs were in sales, first working for Xerox, a major US company, and later working for a French company that sold household goods. Shultz sold coffee machines and became interested in the coffee business. By 1982, he wanted a change of pace. He joined a Seattle company called Starbucks. Jerry Baldwin and Gordon Bowler were the owners of Starbucks. They operated five stores that sold only coffee beans. They specialized in a dark, rich type of coffee called Arabica. The beans were quite expensive.

In 1983, Shultz traveled to Italy, where he observed many people passing the time in coffee shops. They talked, laughed, and drank a dark, rich coffee very similar to the one that Starbucks sold. His observations of Italian coffee shops gave Shultz an idea: After his return to the US, he suggested to the owners of Starbucks that they open a coffee shop in Seattle where people could relax and drink coffee, just like people did in Italy. He would use Starbucks coffee and use the Starbucks name. The owners agreed to Shultz's plan.

The shop quickly became a success. Shultz wanted Starbucks to sell espresso coffee, which was common in Italian coffee shops. The owners did not like the idea, since espresso coffee machines were expensive and difficult to maintain. Shultz also wanted to open more coffee shops, but the owners again refused, since they did not want to expand their coffee-shop business.

Shultz left Starbucks and opened his own coffee shop under a different name. He continued to use Starbucks coffee beans for his coffee. By 1987, Shultz owned three coffee shops. In 1988, he borrowed money and bought the Starbucks name and the six coffee-bean stores, all for \$3.8 million. His coffee shops became so successful that he expanded throughout the US and then, years later, opened his first stores overseas in China. In April, 2023, Shultz stepped down as President of Starbucks and passed on his leadership to Laxman Narasimhan, the new President.
